Those outside of the United Methodist Church also talk much about grace. We interview ministry candidates very specifically around grace. In fact the ministry candidates are expected to speak thoughtfully and deeply around grace. Sadly, many candidates cannot clearly, succinctly, or thoughtfully speak on the Wesleyan understanding of grace. It is almost always used as a jumping off point to speak of the differences between United Methodists, specifically Wesleyans, and other traditions. Further, it is sad when those doing the interviews sometimes say "I could not pass it." I understand that means those that are supposed to understand the idea of grace, the clergy, are weak while our United Methodist Seminaries are weak in helping candidates understand grace. This leads to our own church speaking of grace when we have a weak understanding of what we are saying.

Grace is very complex! Billy Graham states the dictionary definition of grace as "God's unmerited favor towards humanity." So trying to give a short lesson in grace in a page is a tremendous challenge. But here we go!

Biblically speaking Grace is nearly on every page of the Bible. Beginning in Genesis, even the formation of Creation is an aspect of Grace. While there is much more to the Creations, it is God's expression of Love not because He has to, but because He wants to. Grace is not a must to by God, but a want to. So properly speaking, God's grace was active before our birth! Wesley used a lot of big words to describe grace (if you want to know the big words see me), but simply speaking this aspect of grace is the aspect of God working around us and even before us, sometimes without our knowledge of His action. Biblically speaking, God makes the rain fall on the just and the unjust.

God creates the air, water, and earth without our asking! But this aspect of grace is insufficient for salvation. In short, this aspect of God's grace "goes <u>before us</u>" or grace that works "<u>around</u> <u>us.</u>"

While this "grace that goes before us" is always at work and yet insufficient for salvation, there are other aspects of grace at work as well. If we are thinking in a linear fashion, the next aspect of grace is where God declares our sin to be forgiven. Simply speaking God's grace leads us to ask forgiveness, then God's grace through Jesus is granted to us. We can think of this aspect of God's grace as "God's grace at work <u>for us</u>." While we are further along in the growth aspect of grace, there is still more aspects of God's grace at work. At this point, we are forgiven but nothing internally has changed. This is the first half of salvation. This is "saving from guilt." There is no change of the systems around us, because there is no change in us.

Which brings us to the next aspect of God's grace! This is the aspect of God's grace that actually brings change to humans, humanity, and the many structures around us! It is at this point that most United Methodist falter including most candidates and many clergy. This grace is God at work "<u>in us</u>"! Ezekiel makes comment of removing hearts of stone and replace with hearts of flesh (Ez. 36:26) and David writes "create in me a clean heart" (Psalm 51). This is the other half of salvation, the "turning towards God."

For me this is the heart of the Wesleyan doctrines and its greatest gift to help the world. God really wants to change, change everything back to way He designed it! This means changing you, me, and everyone around us, creation, world governments, health care, and judicial systems. But His change starts inside the human heart and works its way outward (see Phil 2:12). The very change that we seek is right before us! This is where we drop the ball! This is where many ministry candidates fail and many seasoned United Methodist clergy fail as well.

We do not expect God to change us, we expect God to change everything (and others as well)! We expect God to swoop in and fix the problems around when God works to fix us. The problem lies in the human heart. This aspect of God's grace goes to places that frankly scare us. It goes to the core of the human and starts to clean house!

The cleaning of our hearts is an ongoing process, which is the next aspect of God's grace in this life. God is at work "*within us*." This is where because our hearts are changed to the point we want God to work with us that we participate with God in the change of our lives and the systems around us. Again, we falter here because we may be willing to let God change us inwardly, but how often do we let God work "*through us*" into the world around us?


So putting it all together, albeit in a very linear way, God begins expressing grace first "*around* <u>us</u>", "*before us*," then "*for us*," then "*in us*," onto "*within us*," and lastly in this life "*through us*." While, I structured this in the linear fashion, God's grace is moving in all these areas all the time. For Wesley, all of this encompasses God's grace. It is a total package. We cannot pick and choose which aspects of grace, we want. That leaves us with a weak understanding of grace.

Wesley's understanding of God's grace has been misunderstood over the years. We have been accused of being "universalists" because we believe that God works before our conversion. We are Universalists, if we do not see the whole scope of grace. We become Universalists if we say that the grace that works "*around us*" is sufficient for salvation. We must ask for grace and be transformed. We have been accused of being "works righteous believers," as we believe that our actions are very important in salvation. But, we understand that our actions are directly tied to God's grace.

So we can insert our weak understanding of God's grace or we can let the fullness of Wesley's understanding of God's grace empower us to be fully mature in Christ.

Fortieth Anniversary of Mystery Ramble to England and France By Marti Theune

Note: This is a story about something I was involved in 40 years ago when life was much simpler. Since we're all United Methodists, I thought you might enjoy reading about it.

It was sunny and hot as we pulled out of the parking lot at Good Shepherd United Methodist Church in Waldorf, Maryland, on Friday, August 10, 1979. Yes, forty years have passed since that monumental trip billed as the "International Mystery Ramble," which took our youth fellowship on a nineday excursion to England and France in 1979! Several parents of participating youth still attend Good Shepherd, and I hear from quite a few of those who now have teens and beyond of their own. I hope you will all enjoy this little recap of a memorable by-gone era.

The planning team consisted of the late Judy Brosky, Youth Advisor, Marti Mumford (now Theune), Youth Coordinator, and Charlie Lightner, former Pastor of Good Shepherd. *On a Mystery Ramble, no one but the three planners knew the destination.* Parents were given sealed envelopes containing a detailed itinerary upon departure, with strict instructions not to reveal destinations should their off-spring figure out a way to communicate with them. This, of course, was way before cell phones and laptops. And, this time, everyone needed a passport!

Thirty-eight people signed up to go. Each person was asked to pay only \$200. Almost all of the rest of the money necessary for such a large undertaking was raised in more than 23 work projects. The tour was generously supported by members and friends of Good Shepherd. Also contributing were the Waldorf Jay Cees who gave a gift of money that paid for a side trip to France, in addition to our week-long stay in London.

We toured Buckingham Palace for the changing of the Guard, Westminster Abbey, Big Ben, Parliament, Trafalgar Square, Soho, Piccadilly Circus, Carnaby Street, Hyde Park (where we saw and photographed actor Charlton Heston hanging out), Greenwich, and St. Paul's Cathedral. We also toured the Tower of London, and had a day-trip to France. Of special interest to us as Methodists was the recently renovated historical chapel where John Wesley founded our denomination. Two very significant events occurred for us there. Pastor Lightner was invited to participate in the christening of a baby and we were permitted to watch. Right after that, we visited the cemetery behind the chapel where John and Charles Wesley are buried. It was quite overgrown with weeds. Thinking of the many times we had done gardening work as a group to raise money for this trip, we volunteered to come back to this historical place and clean it up. Permission was granted. We rented equipment and worked until dark, feeling honored to do it. The tombstone of John Wesley was covered with moss, so one of our girls climbed to the top of it and scraped until it was clean. We had several other similar opportunities to be of service while on our journey, knowing we were being led by God.

I saw a recent picture of Wesley's tombstone, and now it is in a well-kept cemetery within a glass enclosure. The little inner-city church we visited is now a respected historic museum visited by people from all over the world. Little did we know at the time that we were making a significant contribution to the upkeep of our founding father's home church that was in that very year being refurbished in celebration of the 200th anniversary of its founding. (Many of you may remember. We were all asked to contribute.) The pastor there was anxious because the dedication was to take place at the end of the week we were there, and he had no idea how he was going to get the cemetery cleaned up to accommodate a crowd. God dropped a little group of teenagers in his midst at just the right time and with just the right hearts. Such is His amazing grace!
